




# Informational meetings Local Option Levy

North Clackamas School District

#### What is a local option levy?

A local option levy is a short-term tax on property approved by voters to provide operating funds for local schools. All funds raised through a Local Option Levy would stay with the local schools. They could not be used for any purpose other than what voters approve. By law, the local option lasts from three to five years. The number of years is approved by voters and can't be extended without another vote.



#### What could the money be used for?

A local option levy could be used to support schools. The district plans to listen to the community to determine how the funds should be used. Community members are being asked to select their priorities from among several uses, including

- •Hire more teachers, to lower class sizes?
- •Add more school days, so kids have more learning time?
- •Add more education programs?
- •Buy new math books to help meet higher national standards?
- •Add classroom technology, such as computers?

The School Board would like to know what community members think about this proposal. Schools will host listening sessions, where parents and community members can learn about local option levy, ask questions and express concerns that will be communicated to the School Board. Our Superintendent, Tim Mills and other district administrators will be available at these sessions.



# BIKE MILWAUKIE HARVEST RIDE



## Frequently Asked Questions

#### Is this a haunted house?

No, this is a yard display only. The props and the wiring in the yard are not designed for foot traffic.

#### Is there a charge for this display?

The display is free. If you are feeling generous....we take donations in the box in front of the gate.

#### Where did you get your decorations? Are those tombstones real?

Almost everything in the yard display is hand made from materials bought at the local hardware store. The tombstones are cut from 2" Styrofoam and then the lettering is individually hand carved and painted. The abbey is made of 1" white foam carved and mounted on a wood frame.

#### Where do you store all of this?

They are stored in the upstairs portion of the shop (the building behind the abbey.) We have specially designed storage areas for the smaller items and then the larger stuff is stacked up as neat and tight as possible.

#### Is that a real hearse?

No, it is a full scale model of a hearse made of foam and wood.

#### How do you create the ghost in the crypt and the window?

They are video effects. There is a rear projection screen in the crypt and the church with a LCD projector that plays a home made video of a "ghost".

#### When do you start working on all this?

We start planning the yard at the beginning of the year. We go to Halloween conventions and when we get back we start work on new projects as early as May. Our main construction time is July through September when the weather is good for painting.

#### Will anything jump out and scare me?

It has always been our philosophy to create a creepy feel without resorting to the typical haunted house scares. You will see no actors hiding in the yard, popup props, blood and guts or extreme violence.

#### Why do you do this?

We LOVE Halloween! From the days of dressing up and going trick-or-treating to going to haunted houses to creating our own. It allows us the opportunity to express ourselves creatively in a style that we enjoy.

#### Do you sell your decorations?
