## Police Report:

New person starting sworn in on May  $1^{st}$ . 2 weeks of law school to go to – On may  $1^{st}$  coffee w/ a cop Painted Lady from 9am - 11am

Fire affected 2 apartments – person hanging from 3<sup>rd</sup> floor window – was able to get out ok – Today is our K9 officer's last day – working on getting a new handler trained and will then get another dog. Looking for dual certified dog – K9 will live with officer Hall – will see how he settles into retirement – Will take a few months but will start the process and get another K9 officer on board. Question about if our police service has 911 text enabled – answer was yes. Currently have 33 officers on force – full force is 36, so close and hiring up new people now. Area covered – other jurisdictions help cover iin overlap areas.

North Clackamas School District – Ardenwald Elementary School – code compliance issue – parking lot areas separate schools and buses – For some years – using 4 reg buses & 4 special needs buses now – w/ additional curriculum changes will probably add another bus. - Congestion during pick up and drop off times – help to alleviate this issue – Thinking that painting some curbs will help with the traffic movement during the peak times - Kittleson group hired to work on congestion issues by NCSD - School would like more students to ride the bus if possible – Not just enforcing bussing, but also kids walking and biking – crossing at 42<sup>nd</sup> ave – pulled buses from 42<sup>nd</sup>, but now keeping – part of walk safely routes – buses used to come in on wake street - no sidewalks - bus hit a car on wake street - flow through parent parking lot has improved in pm, but not am – there used to be no parking on south side of wake street - no signs put back now - repainting curb, not happening so far - and parents parking by fire hydrants where they should not – crosswalks not effective now – in wrong place – ask Kelley to review and fill in these details - Parents crossing with their kids outside of crosswalks now - especially when it rains - On north side of street what city is it? Portland - Original safe routes to school was drafted and filed before the flip of the parking lot drop off. Chuck did a blind traffic test – 80mph by school – Not many speed limit signs on Roswell so people go faster than they should – 42<sup>nd</sup> is still an issue with school zone speeding area – no hazard lights etc. – add flashing light at 42<sup>nd</sup> and Roswell – barriers on the sidewalk – huge light pole in the way currently – More crosswalks are needed from the parents perspective - Hash the whole entrance - near the park so a whole herd of children and parents would be safer within a hash zone like at the Costco entrance – When the area shifted and grew the boundary so that Lewelling students now come to Ardenwald 32<sup>nd</sup> and 42<sup>nd</sup> should be the same – What about

wrapping improvements to 42<sup>nd</sup> crosswalks with the CIP that will be occurring on that street in the upcoming fiscal year – Mark believes that the funding and projects are set for year 1, but Mark will bring it up this Thursday at the next meeting on this issue. Parents from the north and buses from the south, is better now – immensely better if parking is not allowed on the south side of Roswell

The PTO brought up that changing the parking lot helps, but still a big problem in the morning. Talked about bringing back the restricted parking to only one side of the road, they have requested this before. They asked the county to refer to the Safe Routes to School document for more information. They also mentioned that the school zone is not clearly marked by Meadow Crest.

Lisa Gunion-Rinker asked if the NDA and PTO writing a letter to would help. Mark said that he would get back to us on this idea.

## Committee Reports:

Chair – Jeff not running as chair in May – will continue to run the concerts and would like to mentor someone to run the concerts as well – Most of the concert dates are filled – hope city church will let us know – they are slotted for Aug 9<sup>th</sup> – Beat Patrol – 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday - 4<sup>th</sup> concert not slotted – waiting in 2 bands – Echos of Yazgar - Grateful Dead - ~\$400 concert – another group called Remedy – Steve hall and Super Soul Heros is booked for last thurs – office reached out and they want to do a beer garden – asked them to make a donation to the NDA – when negociated with band – if we feed the band – will they donate \$50 to the concert series – Hope city has also offered to print and mail the flyers - \$600 to mail out to the neighborhood – Abby & Christy would like to be involved in the mailing for the membership details - Hope City sponsors a different nonprofit each month – in August have Ardenwald/JC NDA be the nonprofit of the month. Hope City will be there w/ the bouncy house and ice cream at the concerts. Ask local sponsors such as Providence, Waste Management, etc to help sponsor the concerts.

Jeff mentioned that he is going to ask The Office and Milwaukie for a small donation in order to sell at that concerts.

Chris is going to follow up on a donation from the hospital. Possibly make a list of businesses we should ask for donations from.

Hope City said they would have ice cream and the bouncy house at the first four concerts.

Bryan Dorr asked if we could have only four concerts int the months were there are five weeks. Jeff said that they can be left up to the next president.
